


## The first and most important port in Campania

The tourism boom in the region translates into 8,36 million people passing through the ports of Napoli, Salerno and Castellammare di Stabia, of which 1,73 million cruise passengers (+43,2%). The number of cruise passengers is increasing in this time sharply and the data confirms the attractiveness of the Campania for this tourist segment with 1,63 million people in Naples (+42,9%) and 94.338 in Salerno (+49,7%).


